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
LOGLINE

After serving 35 years in prison for murder, musician Reggie Austin faces an uncertain future back on the streets as he tries to rebuild a life, reconnect with his family, and armed with little else but his heart and his music, find a way to survive.

SYNOPSIS

LIFE & LIFE tracks the journey that musician Reggie Austin takes to redeem his life following a murder conviction 40 years ago. With surprising honesty and depth, the film looks at Austin's effect on his fellow inmates and his efforts to reconnect with his family, as well as questioning parole and sentencing practices through his story. Ultimately, the film reveals the steep and dangerous hill ex-prisoners must climb upon release to free themselves and create a positive future. LIFE & LIFE is a story of the struggle for redemption and hope against near impossible odds, accompanied by a soundtrack that comes straight from Austin's heart.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

My deepest passions are stirred by human rights violations, whether at the hands of dictators or as a result of injustice in the U.S.A. The problem of mass incarceration in the U.S. is so huge it often feels overwhelming. Reggie's story is a path into the deepest complexities of the many issues, especially the not often discussed sentencing and parole practices. He is poetic and penetrating about both the mistakes he made in his own life and the inequities of our criminal justice system. Because he defies expectations and easy categorizations, his story has led me to careful reflection. To what degree do our prisons exist to punish perpetrators, protect the public, or reform those incarcerated? How long is long enough? Reggie can never bring back the life he took, but if he can help bring change, that might be a redemption of its own.

Inspired by the serendipity of our meeting, Reggie's long struggle to right his wrong, and the many lifers I've met since I began this, my goal is for LIFE & LIFE to carve out a significant place in the critical national debate on criminal justice.

ORIGIN OF THE FILM

In 2012, I was in the thick of making *Sound of Redemption, The Frank Morgan Story* (100% Fresh on Rotten Tomatoes.) Frank Morgan was an exquisite jazz saxophonist who spent half of his life in and out of prison, derailed by his heroin habit. Word had it, he did some of his best playing with a big band of fellow jazz junkies in San Quentin. With no archival footage of these historic concerts, I decided to capture the feeling by filming a new live concert in San Quentin with jazz stars who had all known or played with Frank. The audience would be the inmates, as they had been in Frank Morgan's day. We raised the roof in the Q.

At the end of this concert, one inmate asked if he could sit in with the band. The warden nodded his OK. So on Oct 12, 2012, Reggie Austin, inmate # B57661 played a tune with the All-Star band in San Quentin. Later I heard he said the night changed his life.

I kept track of Reggie. Inspired by the concert, he was attempting his 13th parole hearing. I thought I might make a short with a happy ending— a long time prisoner gains parole because of the power of music. When I found out what his crime was, though, I had doubts. Reggie did gain parole in 2015 after 35 years, so I went and interviewed him. I discovered a sensitive man who had radically changed from the criminal he once was.

Reggie never denied he deserved to be punished for his crime, but he was able to pinpoint the many overlapping injustices he and so many others have been through at the hands of the criminal justice system. I was convinced the story merited deeper inquiry. And, as hard as prison had been, nothing could have prepared him for the challenges he would face on the outside.

THE TEAM

NC Heikin, Director

NC Heikin began her career at La Mama Experimental Theater Club in New York and went on to work on and off Broadway as an actress, singer, dancer, writer and director. She has written screenplays for Disney and Paramount as well as French TV networks. In 2004, she made her directing debut with her prize-winning short, mañana, available on Indiepix. Her first documentary, Kimjongilia, about North Korean refugees, premiered at Sundance, won the One World Human Rights Best Film 2010, and has been seen by millions of people around the world, including on The Documentary Channel and Netflix. Her most recent film, Sound of Redemption, The Frank Morgan Story about a troubled jazz musician, was produced by bestselling author Michael Connelly and premiered at the Los Angeles Film Festival in 2014 and theatrically in NY and LA in 2015. It has a 100% Fresh Five Star rating on Rotten Tomatoes, and recently won the Best Biographical Documentary at the Sound on Screen Festival, South Africa. In 2016 Heikin made a short with Lee Child and roots band Naked Blue about their historic collaboration on a CD with songs about Lee's character Reacher (now an Amazon series.) NC is a Sundance and Film Independent Fellow.

Lee Child, Executive Producer

Lee Child is the #1 internationally bestselling author of the **Jack Reacher thrillers**. His debut, *Killing Floor*, won both the Anthony and the Barry awards for the best first mystery, and *The Enemy* won the Barry and the Nero awards for the Best Novel. "Jack Reacher", the film based on the ninth novel, *One Shot*, starred Tom Cruise, Robert Duval, Rosamund Pike, Jai Courtney, and David Oyelowo and debuted in December 2012. Child, a native of England and a former television director, lives in New York City and Wyoming with his wife and daughter. "Reacher," his series on Amazon, was renewed within days of its premiere. Nicole London, producer

Nicole London is the Grammy-nominated Producer of *Miles Davis: Birth of the Cool*, a major international documentary on the legendary musician Miles Davis. Recent credits include *AMERICAN MASTERS Sammy Davis Jr.: I've Gotta Be Me, The Talk: Race in America*, and 16 short films now playing in the Segregation Gallery of the Smithsonian's *National Museum of African American History & Culture* in Washington, DC. Three of her recent films have been nominated for NAACP Image Awards: *Miles Davis: Birth of the Cool, AMERICAN MASTERS August Wilson: The Ground On Which I Stand* and Firelight Media's *The Black Panthers: Vanguard of the Revolution*, the latter of which was also nominated for a 2016 Primetime Emmy. She is currently co-directing with Stanley Nelson a PBS film on Harriett Tubman.

Jessica Wolfson, producer

Jessica Wolfson is an award winning documentary director and producer. Her work has been broadcast on PBS, IFC, Discovery Channel, TLC, and played film festivals such as Sundance, Tribeca, SXSW, DocNYC, Full Frame and more. Jessica has created content for ESPN, PBS, MTV, CBS All Access, Wall Street Journal, Conde Nast. At IFCtv, Jessica developed and produced documentaries with renowned filmmakers including Kirby Dick, Steve James, John Landis, and Jon Favreau. Her documentaries include RADIO UNNAMEABLE (Kino Lorber/PBS), HOT GREASE (DISCOVERY CHANNEL) and THE KANSAS EXPERIMENT (PBS Independent Lens). Jessica has acted as a consultant and impact producer for many documentary projects, a mentor for The Gotham (formerly IFP) and Tribeca Film Institute and teaches at New York Film Academy and Austin Community College.
