A STATEMENT REGARDING PRODUCTION:

Lucy and Whitney, funded exclusively through crowd sourced fundraising and filmed primarily in Washington State, was only afforded a narrow window of two weeks for their production due to schedules of actors and budgetary constraints. Thus, the film only exists thanks to the dedicated efforts of the entire crew as well as many local volunteers from the cities of Steilacoom and Dupont, Washington as well as Provo and Springville, Utah. These resources included lodging for the crew members, elements of production design and locations, serving as extras in the film, as well as even helping out with production. No film is ever made by one person, yet Lucy and Whitney specifically deserves the praise of our small dedicated crew.
