MorningStar Angeline was born in Santa Fe, NM and is Navajo, Chippewa Cree, Blackfeet, and Latina. She participated in local theatre programs growing up and went on to study acting while attending college in California.

MorningStar has an eclectic body of work ranging from camera operative to actress. Her work has been recognized by the American Indian Film Festival, Institute of American Indian Arts and the New Mexico Film and Television Hall of Fame. She is a Sundance 2018 Indigenous Lab Fellow for her short film 'Yá'át'ééh Abíní' and currently resides in Albuquerque, NM.

Vance Banzo - "RINGO LEAVES-NO-SHADOW"

Vance Banzo is a Saulteaux/Cree comedian, actor, and writer born and raised in Edmonton, Alberta. Currently residing in Toronto, Ontario, Vance is a proud member of Canadian sketch comedy troupe, Tallboyz ii Men, who were recently recognized as "Comedians to Watch in 2019."

Andrew Martin - "CHARLIE B."/"CHARITY"

Andrew is of the Mohawk Nation, and grew up on the Six Nations of the Grand River Territory. He has appeared in the films *Fire Song* and *The Guide*.

Ajuawak Kapashesit – "HONEYBOY YELLOWDOG"

White Earth Ojibwe Descendant and Cree, Ajuawak Kapashesit is a relative newcomer to the world of acting, performing in film, television and theatre since 2015.

In early 2017, Ajuawak starred in the award-winning short, *Shinaab*, directed by Lyle Mitchell Corbine, which premiered at the Sundance Film Festival. He stars in the highly-acclaimed feature film *Indian Horse* (based on the book by the late Richard Wagamese) which premiered at TIFF, and winning the

Audience Award at Vancouver Film Festival in the fall of 2017. Recent independent features include: *Indian Road Trip, Ahockalypse* and *Once Upon a River*.

Ajuawak is a trained linguist who focuses on language revitalization and documentation. He is conversational in Ojibwe and has an academic familiarity with Hidatsa, Arikara, Dakota, Chumash and Menominee. He currently resides in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Billy Merasty - "WILLIAM BEARCLAW"/"HOPE"

Billy Merasty (Metis/Cree from Northern Manitoba), is celebrating 35 years in the Performing Arts, and has recently become a member of D.O.T: Dance - with Kaha:wi Dance Theatre's production of *Transmigration*; Opera - with the Canadian Opera Company's production of *Louis Riel*; and, Theatre - with a long list of credits including, Kevin Loring's *Where the Blood Mixes*, Tomson Highway's *Dry Lips Oughtta Move to Kapuskasing*, Daniel David Moses' *Indian Medicine Show*, Omari Newton's *Sal Capone*, and many others. Gail Maurice is a fluent Cree/Michif speaking actor, and an award-winning independent filmmaker and Arts Laureate. She's passionate both in front of and behind the camera. She was awarded the Hnatyshyn Foundation Reveal Indigenous Award for Excellence in the Arts and the Chalmers Arts Fellowship. Gail portrayed "Dorothy Pine" in the hit CTV series *Cardinal*, "Sarah" in the award-winning detective web series, *Cold* and "Inez" in *Falls Around Her*. Soon, you'll see her as "Rita Colchak" in the new *Twilight Zone*. She'll be directing her first bilingual feature film, *Rosie*, this summer.

Creative Bios

Shelley Niro - Director/Writer/Producer

Shelley Niro is a multi-disciplinary artist, and a member of the Six Nations Reserve, Turtle Clan, Bay of Quinte Mohawk. She has worked in a variety of media, including beadwork, painting, photography and film. Her work challenges stereotypical images of Aboriginal peoples. Though her work delves into serious issues and is rich with poignant imagery, Niro inserts humour into her practice. Niro has received considerable attention for her work in film, including her short film *The Shirt*, which was presented at the 2003 Venice Biennal as well as at the 2004 Sundance Film Festival in Park City, Utah and *Kissed By Lightning*, about a Mohawk painter in a state of grief which premiered at the imagineNATIVE Film and won the Santa Fe Film Festival's "Milagro Award for Best Indigenous Film".

Amos Adetuyi - Producer

Amos' TV producer credits include two internationally awarded TV series: *Jozi H*, a medical drama (CBC/SABC) and the dramatic serial *Ekhaya: A Family Chronicle* (CBC/SABC). He also co-produced the dramatic Halifax-based serial *North/South* (CBC), created/produced 100+ episodes of the internationally sold reality series *Skin Deep* (SLICE/Oxygen), wrote and produced the feature performance documentary *It Ain't All Jazz* (Bravo!) and executive produced the feature documentary, *Ganesh, Boy Wonder*. He was also executive producer of *High Chicago* (eOne), starring Colin Salmon.

Floyd Kane - Producer

Floyd Kane is a graduate of Dalhousie Law School. After spending years working as a lawyer and senior executive within the entertainment industry, including a lengthy stint within Salter Street Films where he served as a production executive on numerous projects, including the Academy Award-winning *Bowling for Columbine, Shattered City: The Halifax Explosion, Poko* (Cycles I and II) and *Lexx* (Cycle IV), Floyd began a career as a writer and producer.

In 2005, Floyd created, wrote and produced the drama series, *North/South* for the CBC. He was also one of the co-producers on the feature film *Shake Hands with the Devil* (DHX MEDIA). He went on to write and executive produce *Soul* and to write on shows such as *Continuum* (Syfy), *Backstage* (Disney), *Slasher* (Netflix) and the acclaimed feature film, *Across the Line*, which he also produced.
