Over a romantic Christmas weekend, a young couple retreats to a Colorado cabin, where their relationship is tested by haunted pasts and the sobering present.




THEMES

SYNOPSIS

Set against the rustic winter backdrop of the Colorado Western Slope, "Evergreen" is an intimate character study of an interfaith couple's relationship over a tumultuous Christmas weekend. Paul and Gena have been in a committed relationship for over a year and are at a pivotal point in their lives. Paul is a modern day Catholic, whereas Gena is anything but; Paul wants marriage, while Gena needs physical intimacy and to take their relationship to the next level. When expectations clash, the two set aside their prior notions and agree to a brutally honest, no-holds-barred weekend of "question-and-answer," unearthing long-buried secrets and manifestations from relationships past.



PRODUCER'S STATEMENT

The initial premise for the film was born from a simple idea: maximizing economy. Lead actor Tanner Kalina and myself had spent years developing stories together as independent filmmakers. In the spring of 2017, we sat down and pitched a series of ideas to each other, all based around practical resources we could leverage to make our first feature film on our own terms.

The main draw to this project was a chance to take what our core team had learned from several years working various jobs in the film industry and execute it in a micro-budget setting. It was exciting for us to collaborate with people we care about on a project we believed in, and the ability to prioritize on-set ethics that are often neglected by independent producers working on tight schedules with little money.

Lastly, as someone who has never practiced any sort of religion, I've always found discussions of faith fascinating and was very open to making a film that has authentic dialogue about such a sensitive subject. DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

With "Evergreen," we wanted to focus on real people and how they really talk and laugh and feel and hurt, not just have some talking heads engaged in an ideological or philosophical tennis match about "big ideas." So as my creative team and I delved in, we really strove for the kind of authenticity you find with Richard Linklater and The Duplass Brothers.



For this film, it was critical to me personally that we not try to "say anything" or "prove a point" like in a lot of faith-centric work. Speaking from my own spirituality, faith is full of pain, doubt, and hope. We wanted to examine the relationship both characters had with their own beliefs in comparison to their romantic wounds, and understand the ways in which they were haunted by "faithfulness to the times we had faith."

Our goal was to stay neutral and not come out "for" or "against" any particular religion, but rather to present a relatable experience. Since Day 1, we've been striving for an authentic discussion between two people with different points of view who really want to understand and love each other. Because to me, love and empathy are our most profound qualities anyway.

EXTENDED SYNOPSIS

"Evergreen" is the story of an atypical couple: Paul, a conservative Catholic man, and Gena, a progressive, agnostic woman. The two venture to Paul's family cabin in Colorado for a romantic Christmas getaway. Upon arrival, Paul plans on popping the question, while Gena hopes to physically consummate their relationship (finally). Suffice to say, they have mismatched expectations.

On the couple's first night away, after a few cocktails, their expectations clash. Paul sticks to his strict religious beliefs, ultimately unable to give Gena what she wants. While nursing a hangover the next morning, Gena proposes a wild challenge: to engage in a high-stakes game of question-and-answer while swearing off all physical contact for the weekend. Paul agrees that they must respond to every question the other asks with complete honesty.

What could possibly go wrong?

EXTENDED SYNOPSIS (CONTINUED)


As the weekend progresses, Paul becomes increasingly haunted by moments of his past, particularly involving a mysterious trauma related to his ex-wife, Cassie.

Meanwhile, Gena contemplates her current relationship through imagined conversations with her own ex-lover, Dylan, fruitlessly attempting to convince him (or her subconscious) that she and Paul belong together.

Their isolation leads to paranoia, and the tension ultimately culminates when Gena accidentally finds the engagement ring, ruining Paul's surprise proposal.

When Paul and Gena's questions finally begin to unearth their deepest insecurities, the two discover that the best thing for themselves might not be the best thing for their relationship.

Ultimately, they must decide the fate of their relationship as Christmas draws near.

Olivia Grace Applegate



STOCKING STUFFERS

- * The story began with a single logline and was developed into a 25-page outline prepared by Marshall Kistner (Producer) and Tanner Kalina ("Paul"). The script's first draft was written by Joe Duca (Director), with many subsequent revisions based on an intensive, month-long rehearsal process with the four lead actors. The shooting script locked mere days before the team departed for Colorado.
- * Lead character Gena Ryan's name was inspired by legendary actresses and feminist icons Gena Rowlands and Geena Davis. The character Paul Owen was named after Saint Paul the Apostle.
- * A skeleton crew comprised of only 14 crew members traveled to Meeker, Colorado, from Los Angeles, Austin, and Richmond.
- * Filming during the month of December in wintry Colorado resulted in snowy conditions and some rather cold shoot days. One evening was so frigid, the camera sensor froze (despite being wrapped in hand-warmers), and footage from that scene had to be re-shot the next day.
- * The film's 88-page script was filmed in just 10 shoot days, including a 21-page day accomplished in 13 hours.
- * A Kickstarter campaign was launched with the goal of raising \$6,000 to complete a 'barebones' post production. After hitting that goal on the first day, the grassroots campaign went on to raise over \$15,000.
- * The film's original score was composed by Maverick Dugger, incorporating compositions from ambient artist Alex Roldan. In addition, two original Christmas songs were written and recorded for the film, one by Nashville-based singer/songwriter Lydia Luce, and one by Grammy Award-winning musician Chris Caswell.
- * Coincidentally, many elements of the film's natural sound design created by Raconteur Sound were recorded in the same area of Colorado where the film was shot... at about the same time!
- * Three feedback screenings were held for test audiences, where extended verbal discussions and detailed hand-written surveys provided crucial feedback. The film's first rough cut ran 2 hours and 37 minutes, while the final cut runs 1 hour 36 minutes in length.




